If the length of the slotted bar is 450 mm, find the length of the stroke if the line of stroke passes through the extreme positions of the free end of the lever.
 - (b) What do you mean by Coriolis component of acceleration? Draw all the direction of Coriolis component of acceleration.
 - (c) State and explain Work Energy principle with the help of an example.
- 6. (a) Two mating gears have 20 and 40 involute teeth of module 10 mm and 20° pressure angle. If addendum on each wheel is such that path of contact is maximum and interference is just avoided, find the path of contact, arc of contact and contact ratio. Also find the addendum for each wheel.
 - (b) Two pulleys, one 450 mm diameter and the other 200 mm diameter are on parallel shafts 1.95 m apart and are connected by cross belt. Find the length of the belt required and the angle of contact between the belt and each pulley. What power can be transmitted by the belt when the larger pulley rotates at 200 rpm, if the maximum permissible tension in the belt is 1 x 10³ N and the coefficient of friction between the belt and the pulley is 0.25 ?
 - (c) Differentiate between involute and cycloidal gear tooth profile.
